Best display of vegetables from one farm or home. Exhibit should consist of specimens in numbers according to their size-small, medium and large. Only one specimen is necessary for large vegetables as cabbage, cauliflower,swiss chard. Three specimens are required for medium vegetables such as tomatoes, peppers, onion. Six specimens are required for small vegetables such as beans, peas.

Display container should be no larger than 2 ft. x 3 ft. and 4 inches deep. Display will be judged 50% quality, 25% showman ship, 15% quantity and 10% labeling. All vegetables must be labeled as to variety.

Class 8-Garden Vegetables

Please note that in each case the numbers of specimens required is stated, and in order to compete successfully, you should have these stated amounts.

Please select vegetables which are typical of the variety. LABEL EXHIBITS ACCORDING TO VARIETY.

Exhibits are judged on uniformity of maturity, size and shape. Root vegetables should be gently washed-not scrubbed. Condition plants for show by pulling by roots and then plunging these roots into 100 degree water and let sit overnight in dark place, such as the basement. Remove roots and prepare for the show the next morning. The plants will stay fresh-looking for a couple of days.
